Who is eligible?

Scholarship is open to Nucleus® recipients who are:

- currently completing their final year of school and who have been accepted onto a university or other tertiary education course
- mature aged students who have been accepted onto a university or other tertiary education course
- students currently undertaking a university degree or other tertiary education

Scholarships are awarded on the basis of academic achievement and a demonstrated commitment to the Cochlear ideals of compassion and benevolence.

5 winners per year!

Cochlear™ Europe, Middle East & Africa is offering five scholarship awards each year. Applicants from the following countries/regions are grouped together:

- Austria, Germany & Switzerland
- France, Italy, Portugal & Spain
- Central & Eastern Europe

How to apply

1. Completed application form (see next page).
2. Copy of the applicant's final school academic certificate and details of results and academic transcripts.
3. Copy of the applicant's acceptance notice from the academic institution of choice if commencing first year of study.
4. A succinct list of academic and extra-curricular activities or awards (including dates and not exceeding one page in length).
5. A personal statement supporting the application. The applicant should describe, using simple and direct language, the area of proposed study, their aspirations and reasons why they wish to be considered for the Cochlear Graeme Clark Scholarship. This statement should be typed and must not exceed 1,000 words.
6. Proof of age and citizenship (e.g. photocopy of the applicant's birth certificate or passport).
7. Name, address and telephone details for three referees.
8. Written proof of residence (e.g. photocopy of a utility bill or bank statement).
9. Proof of change of name, if appropriate (e.g. photocopy of marriage certificate or deed).

Please do not send original documents where copies have been requested, as documents will not be returned.
